From the Bishop:

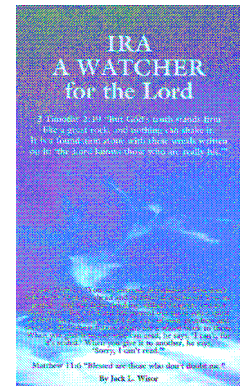
The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is desperately seeking for a solution to reduce the recidivism rate for former inmates and offenders and to shrink the prison population. I have been telling the elected representatives and senators for the last few years, as well as the governor and leaders in the corrections and parole and probation systems, that God has given me that solution and I am eager to show them how to bring that solution alive by working with me and through the Just for Jesus Challenge Homeless Outreach Ministry. The solution is churches, faith-based ministries and outreaches operating under the guidelines of this Ministry as God has given them to me over the last 10 years.

I have been invited to attend a statewide meeting on July 31st where I believe God will provide a prime opportunity for me to once again make these leaders aware of the solution – for them to accept or reject. They will either accept God's plan or reject it. Pray for them that they will be open and obedient to what God wants to accomplish through me and this Ministry.

As the founding minister of the First Apostles' Doctrine Church and founder of the Just for Jesus Challenge Homeless Outreach, the largest faith based homeless ministry in Pennsylvania, I am always eager for any opportunity to share my testimony of how Christ has touched and eternally changed my life. Bishop Wisor To Address The State in July 30th Press Conference

Bishop Jack Wisor will be speaking from the steps of the State Capitol in Harrisburg on Monday, July 30th from 1:00-2:00 PM.

Bishop Wisor will be addressing the needs of inmates and offenders who have been released from prison or jail and are looking to become productive, effective members of society. The correctional system calls this “re-entry”. This press conference is being held in advance of Bishop Wisor’s appearance at a meeting in Philadelphia on July 31st, where he will speak of what God has done through him and the Just for Jesus Ministry to establish opportunities for large numbers of

inmates who have been released to prepare for effective and successful re-entry into their home communities or new communities of their choice.

Bishop Wisor has established a remarkable and highly recognized track record of providing former inmates with the opportunities, encouragement and programs needed to properly prepare for re-entry, all centered in the unconditional love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ as demonstrated to them through Bishop Wisor and the ministry.

Bishop Wisor’s accomplishments are even more remarkable when one considers that a large majority of the offenders that he has helped and guided successfully are Megan Law Offenders and Sexual Violent Predators, a segment of the offender population that virtually no one else in the state is willing to accept or work with. Bishop Wisor has brought great persecution upon himself for his willingness to be obedient to his Lord and Savior and to turn no one away and to provide unconditional acceptance to all, regardless of their offense. As Bishop lives out daily, “hate the sin, but love the sinner”.

Bishop Wisor Invited to Meet with State Leaders – Community Re-entry Programs for Offenders

Bishop Jack Wisor has been invited by Senator Stewart Greenleaf, Chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee, to meet with Senator Greenleaf, Secretary of Corrections John Wetzel, the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole and other representatives of secular and faith based organizations to discuss the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania’s desire to reduce offender recidivism rates by improving the resources and tools available to released inmates through re-entry programs.



Bishop Wisor will be meeting with these leaders in Philadelphia on July 31st at 10:00AM.

As noted above, Bishop Wisor has extensive experience in providing a highly effective opportunity for former inmates to prepare for re-entry into their home communities or communities of choice. Bishop Wisor is also widely recognized as an expert working with the homeless population in Pennsylvania. Through the Just for Jesus Ministry, Bishop Wisor has established Bible-based 12 Step programs for former inmates and offenders as well as providing them with opportunities to learn vocational and life skills that will benefit them for the balance of their lives.

Of greatest importance and value, though, is teaching the Word of God to the former inmates, demonstrating the love and nature of Jesus Christ to them daily through his own life and example, giving them hope and helping them realize that they have been forgiven by Christ and by Bishop Wisor and that they must work, over time, to re-establish ties with family and deal with unfinished business in their lives. This Bible-based, Christ-centered core of the Just for Jesus Ministry is the real reason why so many of the offenders have left Just for Jesus prepared and hopeful to re-enter their communities along with being equipped with skills that they did not have when they first came to the ministry.

Bishop Wisor has demonstrated what it takes to make a former inmate ready for successful re-entry. Pray that these state leaders will listen to what he has to offer them on July 31st and long beyond.

Bishop Wisor Has Welcomed Over 900 Guests!

Since heeding the voice of God and turning his home over to the homeless in 2003, Bishop Wisor has seen over 900 guests from every imaginable and unimaginable circumstance arrive at the doors of the ministry. It began with his first guest, Steve, a product of Hell's Angels, who admitted to being responsible for men not walking or talking any longer. But when asked to kill, Steve knew it was time to get out. Bishop Wisor talks to this day about never seeing a man cry so uncontrollably as Steve did at the altar that day when he surrendered his heart, mind and life to Jesus Christ.



The names and faces of the homeless who have shown up at Just for Jesus to become guests of Bishop Wisor are the familiar and the unknown. Family members who are no longer wanted by anyone in their families. Friends who have worn out their welcome in someone's home or apartment. Veterans of our military whose lives are torn and tattered and who can find nowhere to call their home. Ministers in the local area who drop their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren off at Bishop Wisor's doorstep because they no longer want to or know how to care for their own offspring. People from down the street and across the state. Families with children. Sometimes fathers or mothers with children. People not being able to afford rent or mortgages. Evicted or foreclosed upon. People who have received treatment and care in area hospitals, mental health clinics and other social service agencies and now have nowhere to go when ready for release. Inmates in county jails and state prisons with nowhere to go when they are released. People passing through the Brockway and Brookville area in need of shelter, food and perhaps a shower and clean clothes.

The common denominator is that they are all homeless and in need of a place to live until they get on their feet and decide what they want to do with their life at that moment. Bishop Wisor gives them a safe, comfortable place to live, makes sure they are fed and clothed and shares the Word of God with them – allowing the Word to work on them, always hoping that they will recognize the need to accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

Bishop Wisor's mentor and long-time friend, Rev. Richard Moyer, commented to Bishop Wisor when Bishop told him about God's desire for him to turn his home over to the homeless – "Jack, I've lived here most of my life and I've never seen homeless people in Brockway." Bishop Wisor told Rev. Moyer that he knew what God wanted him to do. Thank God that Bishop Wisor listened to what God was telling him to do. Rev. Moyer is undoubtedly smiling in heaven knowing that so many guests have just arrived at Just for Jesus – in Brockway, the town without any homeless!

Bishop Wisor's Commitment to Community Service

One of the very important elements of the vision of the ministry God has given to Bishop Wisor that many people may not yet be aware of is Bishop Wisor's commitment to undertaking "community service" projects.

Community service projects are important for several reasons:

- They provide a solution for a specific need that someone in the community has who does not have the resources needed to accomplish it themselves
- They provide Bishop Wisor the opportunity to show the guests how to "give back" to the community out of gratitude and the love of Christ

- They are a highly visible means to show the community that the guests are eager to be helpful and responsible
- They provide Bishop Wisor with opportunities to teach the guests new life skills that give them a sense of accomplishment as well as newly-acquired skills that they can potentially use in the job market or in learning to live on their own

An example of this community service is the handrail and guardrail system around a deck (see pictures below) built for a lady in Indiana, PA who was told by the management of the trailer park in which she lives that she needed such protection around the perimeter of her deck or she would be fined. She did not have the resources to pay a contractor to do the work but did have the resources to purchase the materials. She remembered seeing an article about Bishop Wisor and the ministry in the *Indiana Gazette* a few months back and that Bishop Wisor undertakes various community service projects for the reasons listed above. She contacted Bishop Wisor who in turn sent two guests of the ministry skilled in carpentry and construction along with a supervising volunteer staff member. The project was completed in the course of one beautiful, sunny day.



This sign is placed at every community service project site undertaken by Bishop Wisor. It recently was erected at a house in Brockport, where Bishop Wisor and the ministry are helping an older couple sort through the belongings of their old home that Bishop Wisor and the guests will salvage and dismantle afterwards. Usable items will be offered for a donation at the “freely given” rummage sales - one of which exists at each Just for Jesus outreach as part of the vision of the ministry. The salvage operation will help raise much needed funds for the operating expenses of the ministry.



Pig Roast & Fellowship in “Eden”

Bishop Wisor and the First Apostles’ Doctrine Church recently hosted a weekend of fellowship in Brockport. Camping in “Eden” was made available to those interested on Friday and Saturday evenings – some under the stars, some in tents and some in campers donated to the ministry.

Saturday began with the pig being slow-roasted on a spit built from scratch by Bishop Wisor and the guests. While the day progressed, many church members, guests of the ministry and invited visitors spent their time in a number of recreational activities, including: horseback riding, three and four wheeler rides, softball, horseshoes, badminton, volleyball, hiking and just relaxing in the warm sun.



The late afternoon meal featured the now-finished pig along with fish caught and stuffed by Bishop Wisor and roasted in the fire as well as many side dishes and deserts brought by church members, guests and visitors.

There was much fellowshiping and testifying of the Lord Jesus Christ throughout the day and evening. Acts 2:42 came to life, as it does DAILY at the First

Apostles' Doctrine Church and the Just for Jesus Challenge Homeless Outreach Ministry: "in the breaking of bread, fellowship and prayers."

Sunday morning service was held by Bishop Wisor along the creek – a powerful message from Bishop Wisor's "The Kingdom of God" Series, with over 70 in attendance. More chairs will be needed for the next outdoor service!

Near Heaven, a Christian musical group who heard Bishop Wisor preach at the Christian Fellowship Church in State College, traveled to Eden and played before and during the morning service and then led all in attendance with a time of song and fellowship in the afternoon after the meal. Near Heaven was a blessing to Bishop Wisor and all who had an opportunity to hear their heartfelt music. Praise God, they have agreed to come back and play during the upcoming Tent Revival, August 6-12!

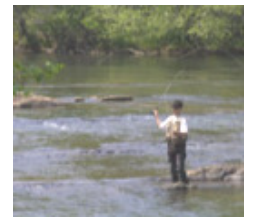
There was another meal after the service, featuring left over pork, along with hot dogs, sloppy joes, pulled chicken and many other wonderful dishes.

Chicken, Turkey and Rooster Roast – Sermon on the Creek

Bishop Wisor and the First Apostles' Doctrine Church hosted another weekend of fellowship in Brockport, June 22-24. Camping in "Eden" was made available to those interested on Friday and Saturday evenings.



Saturday featured a fishing competition and sharing of the Word of God known as "Sermon on the Creek". Those registering for this event had 8 hours to work for three prizes – highest number of inches of all fish caught and thrown back; longest fish caught of the day (must be shown) and the highest number of inches of all fish caught, both thrown back and kept.

Throughout the day of fishing on the area creeks, Bishop Wisor approached the fishers, speaking to them from the Word of God and ministering as the Holy Ghost directed. It was a unique and divine time!

Chickens, turkeys and roosters were roasted on the spit while many other food dishes were prepared and served. While the day progressed, a number of recreational activities were provided, including: horseback riding, three and four wheeler rides, softball, horseshoes, badminton, volleyball, hiking to name just a few. Eden Comes Alive

After some years of waiting, Bishop Wisor is finally seeing Eden “come alive”. What does that mean?

Part of the vision given by God to Bishop Wisor involves having the Brockport property becoming a “living Bible”, a place where church members, guests and visitors can literally “walk through the Bible” and visit the places spoken of in the Word of God as well as experience some of the Bible stories that are familiar to most.

Today, you can visit Eden and be pointed to: Bethlehem, Jerusalem, Emmaus, Damascus, Golgotha, The Jordan River. You can visit with: The woman at the well; Daniel in the Lion’s Den. Spend some time at: The Tomb, Gehenna, The Great Gulf, The Place of the Skull. The pillars pulled down by Samson, The burning bush, the Prodigal son’s pig pen. Will you walk by the wounded man or be a Good Samaritan? Can you find the Serpent in the Garden or the Tree of Life?

Bishop Wisor Provides His Guests With Many Opportunities

In fulfillment of the vision of the ministry that God has given him, Bishop Wisor provides many opportunities to the guests to learn new skills that will serve them well as long as they are on this earth. Not only do they learn those new skills, they are given an opportunity to experience a true and well-deserved sense of accomplishment, something that many of the guests have never experienced in their lifetimes before becoming a guest of Bishop Wisor’s.

It is also very important for the guests to assume responsibility for something other than themselves and to take the focus off of themselves – whether it be feeding or watering the animals, cleaning the barn, planting, weeding and harvesting the garden, learning to repair and restore old vehicles and trucks and on and on.



Guests who so choose may feed and provide water daily to the various animals at Just for Jesus (currently two horses, a pig of grand proportions, chickens, roosters, rabbits, earthworms and cats). In the near future, at a minimum, goats and sheep will be added.

Guests have helped Bishop Wisor till and prepare the large garden for planting. They have planted a wide variety of vegetables and are expecting a bountiful harvest which will be shared with both outreaches. Weeding, watering and caring for the garden continue daily. If there is sufficient harvest, guests will

be given the opportunity to learn how to freeze and can for the winter months.

Guests who show an interest in learning how to repair and restore older vehicles, trucks, lawn tractors, etc. are taught by Bishop Wisor and provided with many new mechanical skills. The repaired and restored vehicles are then used within the ministry or occasionally offered for sale in order to generate needed income.

All of these opportunities result in guests learning how to do things – valuable things – that they did not know before coming to the ministry. Bishop Wisor gives them a true sense of accomplishment and achievement as well as the life and practical skills that they will be able to use for the rest of their lives, regardless of how long they stay at the ministry or where they may move on after leaving.
